"I remember catching the first train from Prestwick to Glasgow to get tickets then all the rumours started.

The "Lick It Up" single was due out but the advert was a negative sort of picture so you could still not see their faces. I had heard they would be in full make up, then they would do half a set in make up then last half non make up and so on.

The gig was great as far as I remember, Vinnie sucked and still does, not much of a show but the crowd roared when the cover came off the tank drum riser. I have the show on CD and notice Vinnie's guitar overloud on the first song creatures of the night. Genes solo was the same backing music he used on the "Creatures" tour with the make up and blood spewing so it was rather weird seeing him non-blood and non make up with all these horror movie bell chimes and moaning bass guitar.

The drum solo was with the smoke spewing out the tank turrets and moving side to side but no smoke explosion effect from the turret. 

Christmas just would not be Christmas for most Apollo fans without a special mention for the Sensational Alex Harvey Band and their legendary shows at the Apollo.



Three new Xmas dates by Harvey

BECAUSE OF THE HUGE ticket demand for their four special Christmas concerts — two each in Glasgow and London — the Sensational Alex Harvey Band are to play another three dates at the same venues. The gigs originally announced a fortnight ago, and now virtually sold out, are at Glasgow Apollo Centre (December 18 and 19) and London New Victoria Theatre (23 and 24). The additional concerts, confirmed this week, are at the Apollo on December 20 and at the New Victoria on December 21 and 22.

Tickets for the extra gigs are now on sale — priced £1.75, £1.50, £1.25 and £1 for Glasgow and £2, £1.65 and £1.25 for London. For the time being, they are again restricted to four per person, although this limitation may be lifted if there are any remaining seats closer to the time of the concerts. A spokesman for the Apollo summed up ticket demand as "monster", while the New Victoria general manager commented: "Business is like the name of the hand — sensational".

Hope to see some of your at the SAHB gig at the Barrowlands on New Years Eve. We will be looking out for Apollo T-shirts in the crowd and on the stage. Cheers folks.
